

Emergency Medicine Research Short Course

5 month course commencing 28th July, 2014 (offered semesters 1 and 2)

Course Content:

Research Methods

- Introduction to research methods used in observational studies
- Practical skills required in the design and assessment of a research project
- Protocol design, including study type selection, introduction to questionnaire design, sampling methods, and ethics approval
- Planning data management and statistical analysis and developing a study budget
- Introduction to the role of qualitative research

Evidence Based Medicine

- Appropriately formulate answerable clinical questions
- Scientific literature search
- Critical appraisal of scientific literature and evidence based guidelines
- Application of research to clinical practice
- Barriers to changing practice

Who should attend: This course is suitable for:

- Advanced trainees in Emergency Medicine
- Clinicians and allied health personnel with an interest in Emergency Medicine Research
- Meets Regulation 4.10 requirements of the Australasian College for Emergency Medicine (ACEM)
