COURSE CONTENT:

Research Methods

- Introduction to research methods used in observational and interventional studies
- Development of practical skills required for design and assessment of research projects, including: protocol design, study type selection, questionnaire design and sampling methods
- Exploration of process and documentation for research ethics
- Investigation of data management and statistical analysis
- Development of study budgets
- Introduction to the role of qualitative research

Evidence Based Medicine

- Formulation of answerable clinical questions
- Conduct of independent scientific literature search
- Critical appraisal of scientific literature and evidence based guidelines
- Exploration of the application of research to clinical practice
- Critical appraisal of statistical reporting in emergency medicine literature

Professor Peter Cameron MBBS, MD, FACEM, FIFEM, FCEM(hon)

Professor Cameron is a Consultant Emergency Physician and Professor of Emergency Medicine. He is Immediate Past President of the International Federation for Emergency Medicine and Past President of the Australian College for Emergency Medicine. He has attracted in excess of 20 million dollars in competitive research grants and has over 400 peer reviewed publications. Professor Cameron is Academic Director of The Alfred Emergency & Trauma Centre and Head of the Critical Care Research Division at Monash University. As well as managing a large number of research and contract grants for clinical and health services research, he consults widely on health policy and health services development, supervises multiple clinical and academic trainees and sits of a number of internationally recognised journal editorial boards.

Associate Professor Mitra is a Consultant Emergency Physician at the Alfred Hospital. He has received NHMRC scholarships and has a keen interest in trauma resuscitation, epidemiology, health systems, policy and management. He holds a Masters in Health Services Management and a PhD in clinical medicine.

Dr Gerard O'Reilly is a Consultant Emergency Physician, Biostatistician and International Programs Manager at the Emergency and Trauma Centre of The Alfred Hospital, Melbourne.
