- A TOTAL OF 192 CREDIT POINTS ARE REQUIRED WITH
- A MAXIMUM OF 60 POINTS FROM FIRST YEAR LEVEL UNITS,
  - AT LEAST 36 POINTS FROM SECOND YEAR LEVEL UNITS AND
  - AT LEAST 36 POINTS FROM THIRD YEAR LEVEL UNITS\*.
  - AND 48 POINTS AT FOURTH YEAR LEVEL†

\* Notes: PSY2112 Organisational Psychology may be taken as an elective at Second or Third Year Level

†To be eligible for progression to the fourth year of the course students must achieve at least the minimum entry requirement that is standard for all Honours programs in Psychology based on the average grade across all core third-year units.

**Students who do not meet the entry requirements for the Honours program in the BPsych(Hons) will qualify for the award Bachelor of Psychological Science provided they have successfully completed the first three years of the program as outlined above.**

**These students will be eligible to apply for entry to other fourth year psychology programs at Monash (e.g., Postgraduate Diploma of Psychology) or at other universities.**
